**Budget Hearing Meeting**

The Budget Hearing Meeting was called to order at 7pm. Present were Chairman Rich Brandl, Supervisors Matt Shinkus, Mary DeYoung, Clerk/Treasurer Karen Teliszczak, PWD Bill Henning and four citizens. The budget for 2017 was presented. There were several questions asked and answered. There was a motion by Rick Getka to approve the 2017 Town of Sharon Budget and set the levy at \$457,677.00, seconded by Deb Shinkus, motion carried by a 9-0 vote. Mary DeYoung then motioned that Resolution #11-14-2016, to adopt the Town Levy at \$457,677.00 be approved, seconded by Matt Shinkus, motion carried by a 3-0 vote. Deb Shinkus moved to adjourn the Budget Hearing Meeting, seconded by Rick Getka, motion carried by a 9-0 vote.

**Regular Board Meeting**

The Regular Board meeting was called to order at 7:15pm. Present were Chairman Rich Brandl, Supervisors Matt Shinkus, Mary DeYoung, Clerk/Treasurer Karen Teliszczak, PWD Bill Henning and several citizens. The minutes were read from the October 10<sup>th</sup> meeting. Mary moved to approve the minutes as read, seconded by Matt, motion carried by 3-0 vote. The minutes were read from the October 19<sup>th</sup> meeting. Matt moved to approve the minutes as read, seconded by Mary, motion carried by 3-0 vote.

- 1) Chief VanderVeen was present to give his report. It was a very busy month. There were 9 EMS calls, 22 fire incidents, 8 car accidents. One person resigned. Did some public relations—helped in October with trick or treating. Also some fire prevention with the school.
- 2) Public Works Director's contract signed
- 3) Mary moved to approve the auditor's contract for \$3950 for 2017, seconded by Matt. Motion carried by 3-0 vote.

**Reports**

Chairman—went to Allen's Grove to look at a foundation from an old house that was a concern of a citizen. It is not in our right-of-way. It is on private property. All seats on the Town Board are up for re-election in the spring.

Clerk/Treasurer—there were 494 voters at the November 8<sup>th</sup> election; we received a reminder non-compliance letter from the State on our G-7 properties; need some suggestions for our newsletter.

Public Works Director—we need to start thinking about re-stripping some of our roads next year; we will check with the County on some pricing; there is a problem with the front wheel assist on the tractor. Have checked the fuses, but that is not the problem; mounted the plows on the trucks; got some prices for metal roofing for the shelter-\$1135 at Menards.

The bills were presented. Mary moved to approve the bills, seconded by Matt. Motion carried by 3-0 vote.

Mary moved to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Matt. Motion carried by 3-0 vote.
